What does your Corps Officer do? (Challenge Task for Crest Award)

This task will include illustrations and should take you at least three A4 pages.

You could:

- collect pictures from Army publications (such as the *War Cry*);
- or draw some pictures;
- or take some photographs;
- your corps newsletter will help you too.

Try to talk with your officer and other Salvationists such as the Corps Sergeant Major or members of the Corps Pastoral Care Council to gather information.

Some of these headings might be helpful in setting out your pages. There are questions under each one to help you when talking to your officer. You may not wish to use them all, they are suggestions only and you may think of others to ask.

Activities held at your corps through the week.

- What activities are held in our corps through the week?
- Which ones do you attend? How often?
- What do you have to do to prepare?

Ceremonies an officer can be asked to conduct.

- What ceremonies can you be asked to conduct?

Preparing for Sunday meetings.

- What do you have to do to prepare?
- Who helps you on a Sunday?

What an officer does in any one day.

- Tell me about a normal day in your week.

Why an officer would be called to the police station.

- Why would you be called to the police station?
- What would you be expected to do when you get there?
- How often does this happen for you?

Helping the community.

- What events does our corps run for anyone to attend?
- What kind of welfare services do we provide?
- Do you do this on your own?

Praying for our officers.

- How can I/we pray for you?
- What are your special needs for this week?
